From the desk of Fr. Paulo...

ORDINARY TIME – TIME to ENRICH OUR LIVES SPIRITUALLY

We now enter the Liturgical Season (Worship) called Ordinary Time and this commences after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The lively green hue that colors the sanctuary drapes and altar clothes speak to us visibly and almost in tangible manner invite us to enter in spirit this Ordinary Time.

We are now In the Cycle of Year C and the Gospels of the weekdays will be mostly be from St. Mark while the Sunday will be from St. Luke. The Catholic Church wisely draws all the 4 Gospels out into our hearing at our worship – masses in the Liturgical Cycles of A, B & C.

Let us take this wonderful spiritual opportunity to enrich our lives this year 2019 with the Word of God being proclaimed to us every day and most especially on Sundays. Strive to listen attentively at the Word of God proclaimed by the lectors and the priest. Reflect on them and make them a part of your life. Better yet, read ahead the Sunday readings at home so that your understanding of the Scriptures proclaimed will be easily absorbed. If the lector or the priest do not proclaim the Scriptures clearly or audibly let them know. We need you to say; “I could not hear you” or “I did not understand what you read.” We all need to assist one another to make our Liturgy meaningful and enriching spiritually. Do your part!

PARISH PLANS for the PURCHASE of NEW STATIONS of the CROSS

Our old Stations of the Cross were taken down last year (2018) during the renovations of the interior of the church. Those Stations were kindly made by late +Philip Trifilo and truly served the needs of the parish, but with years of wear and teared many paintings were warped and in need of replacements. The plan to replace those Stations of the Cross were in the process but were delayed for the past 2 years and placed as Phase II of the church interior devotional improvements. The purchase of the 14 Nativity Scene figures were considered as Phase I since they were in immediate need of replacements.

Starting next week, we will begin to invite you all to assist us by participating in our parish goal to purchase the new 14 Stations of the Cross for Lent 2020. The replacement Stations of the Cross (14) comes to the total of \$12,000.00 and we want to make it available to many parish Ohana's as possible by making the purchase a year- long endeavor. Therefore; it comes to about \$ 72.00 a month per family who wish to participate. You could also join another ohana and share the cost and station! (\$12,000/ divided by 14 = \$ 857. And divided by 12 = \$71.42).

These 14 Stations of the Cross will remain for a long time for generations to use in their Lenten devotions.

ROE vs Wade 46TH ANNIVERSARY – TUESDAY, JANUARY 22, 2019

This coming Tuesday marks the sad anniversary of the passage of U.S. Supreme Court ruling of legalized Abortion.
