MAHALO KE AKUA!

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord.

Today we celebrate the Feast of The Presentation of the Lord. This beautiful feast originated in the 4th Century in Jerusalem and eventually came to be celebrated in Rome by the middle of the 5th Century under its Greek title "Feast of Meetings" also known as "Candlemass Day."

The feast commemorates 40 days after the birth of infant Jesus Christ who was presented in the Temple in the Jerusalem by Mary and Joseph in obedience to the customary Jewish Law - Torah.

This ritual signifies the ritual purification of Mary the mother after giving birth to Jesus and to perform the redemption of the firstborn son, in obedience to the Torah (Leviticus 12:, Exodus 13:12-15).

Gospel of Luke explicitly states that Joseph and Mary took the option provided for the poor (those who could not afford a lamb -Leviticus 12: 8), they offered a pair of turtledoves or pigeons.

Upon bringing infant Jesus to the Temple, they encountered Simeon, who prophesized to Mary; "Behold this child is set for the fall and the rising of many in Israel, and a sign that is spoken against, a sword will pierce through your own souls, that thoughts out of many hearts may be revealed." (Luke 2:34-35).

We encounter Jesus Christ in our lives and upon doing so, the truth of our hearts are laid bare. We choose to follow His commandments thus "to rise-eternal life" or reject His Commandments, "to fall-hell." On this Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, we must reflect honestly what is the state of present my life?
