## MONTH of MAY – MONTH of the HOLY ROSARY

Throughout the weekends of the month of May, the holy Rosary will be prayed 30 minutes before mass led by the assigned prayer leaders. We encourage everyone to pray the rosary daily and when possible to join the parish community for the Rosary prayer.

Make a little sacrifice and come a little early (30 minutes) before the holy mass and join others in the Rosary prayers, the Rosary, a prayer that immerses us into the Sacred Scriptures (the mysteries of the decade), truly dear to Our Blessed Mother (St. Theresa of Little Flower & many saints saw the rosary prayers – Hail Mary prayed as Roses) and most of all, a powerful weapon against the devil and evil in the world.

Bishop Oliver Dacshe Doeme of Nigeria stated; “he is being driven by a God given mandate to lead others in praying the rosary...” He said this in response to what he had experienced during the most horrible attacks inflicted by the Islamist terrorist group Boko Haram in his Diocese of Maiduguri, located in northeastern Nigeria’s Borno State, one of the worst hit areas. It was there that the terrorists seized more than 250 girls from a school in Chibok, most of which have never been seen again.

Many churches, schools, convents were destroyed while hundreds of his Catholic faithful were wounded, taken as slaves or slaughtered.

While in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, he had a vision of Jesus who extended a sword toward him, and he in turn reached out for it. “As soon as I received the sword, it turned into a rosary,” adding that Jesus then told him three times; “Boko Haram is gone.”

Bishop Oliver later told EWTN New that “prayer, particularly the prayers of the Rosary, is what will deliver us from the claws of this demon, the demon of terrorism that is the real demon. Terrorism is an act, a means to an end. It is what is driving the terrorism that is the real demon.

We are led by the society-world that has embraced complacent styles of living, void of God. More and more, those who strive to remain faithful daily will face persecutions if not difficult trials. Without God’s assistance we cannot prevail. What graces can be given to us and what protection of a Mother’s embrace we can have in our earthly journey! Pray earnestly and attentively, strive never to pray manners not befitting our beloved Mother.

Praying the Rosary, Eucharistic Adoration and Holy Mass are sure ways that anchors our lives to Jesus Christ in times of turbulent storms we must face. In reference to the parable of the persistent widow, Jesus stated “**I tell you; he will see to it that justice is done for them speedily.
